## **OUR OBJECTIVES**

- To give free treatment to stray animals and birds in need.
- To provide shelter to the injured or sick stray animals.
- To promote adoption of stray dogs, cats and handicapped birds in which animal loving people can adopt the animals.
- To provide facilities for shelter, dispensaries, ambulances, etc. to eliminate the suffering of animals.
- To rescue abused, injured or sick stray animals
- To conduct campaigns to secure legal recognition for animal rights nationally and internationally
- To promote vegetarianism
- To promote Animal Birth Control program (ABC) and discourage brutal extermination of stray animals.
- To create awareness amongst people, so as to start a mass movement against cruelty by organizing awareness programme in schools and colleges
- To appoint maximum number of volunteers to spread awareness in the city people about rights of animals and birds.
- To explain people to use eco friendly products.
- To organize medical camps in villages for cattle and stray animals of the villagers.
- To organize anti-rabies vaccination camps in the city
- Discourage the festivals which harm any animals / birds.
- To bring awareness for the laws of working animals



# OUR ACTIVITIES

## Rescue and Rehabilitation



We treat 4000+ sick/ injured stray animals every year and we have provided treatment to 70,000+ animals till date.

## Sterilization



An extremely important project to control the growing population of stray dogs and hence maintaining harmony between stray animals and humans

## Bird Camps



Every year during kite festival we get 300+ cases of birds getting injured by the chinese thread. We treat them and let them fly back into the open sky.

## Adoptions



It makes us the happiest when our rescued babies find their furever home. We aware people to adopt and not shop, because Rescued is the best breed!

## Vaccination to Stray Dogs



**Vaccinating stray dogs helps to preventing the spread of zoonotic diseases to humans. Human welfare through Animal Welfare!**

## Waterbowl Project



**Water is a basic need for every living creature, even for those who cannot fetch it themselves. Hence we distribute bowls and encourage locality people to fill it daily.**

## Reflective Collar drives



**We have taken this initiative to make the stray dogs sleeping on roads at night visible as the radium illuminates when a vehicle's light appears on it, hence avoiding accidents.**

## Awareness Campaigns



**Awareness is an important branch of Animal Welfare. Today's aware kid will become tomorrow's responsible citizen. Hence we conduct camps in school, colleges and streets.**

# **PRESENTING OUR EXISTING ANIMAL SHELTER AND HOSPITAL**

**A HOME FOR SPEECHLESS ANIMALS  
UNDERTAKING TREATMENT**

**A HOME OF PERMANENTLY DISABLED HOMELESS ANIMALS**



This room holds immense importance for us; our skilled veterinary doctors perform all required minor and major surgeries here. Our **Operation Theatre** is equipped with all facilities and medical equipments needed for conducting surgeries.



Next to our surgery room is our Radiology unit which is equipped with **X-ray machine and Ultrasound Sonography machine**. It is always our endeavour to provide these injured and sick animals with all services under one roof till they completely recover. Good food, timely medication, adaptable environment, blood reports, USG reports, X-ray and of course lots of love and care



**Ambulance.** Whenever any injured or sick animal is reported to us on our Helpline, our Ambulance rushes to the spot to provide on-site treatment to the animal in need. We have ambulance facility for both small and large animals.



**Pathology Laboratory:** Our lab is equipped with different analyzers to carry out blood and urine reports for accurate diagnosis of any sick / injured stray animal.





The rooms where the sick and injured animals live when they're under treatment. This place is spread over in an area of 40 feet x 70 feet, containing A, B & C blocks. These rooms can accommodate 70 animals at a time. We've facilitated each room with lights and fans, makes it look like a hotel for speechless animals. The rooms are built with proper drainage and ventilation facilities so to make the surrounding healthy, comfortable and adaptable for the admitted animals. We've left open space on all the sides of the rooms, allowing our kids to play and roam freely.





As we already described, our animal shelter also houses an animal hospital, hence we require medicines in a huge quantity on daily basis. To stock the medicines for out mute patients, we've built a medicine room. Some medicines and vaccines that are heat sensitive are stocked in a refrigerator

**Residential room of the caretaker family.** Our kids love their food; the caretaker family living here cooks healthy delicious meals for our kids. This family also keeps the place of animals neat and tidy





With passage of time, we had to deal with some cases of animals that couldn't be sent home after their treatment, for example, blind, differently-abled, and some aged animals. In this way, we have many permanent residents at our Shelter who will stay with us lifetime. Aashiyana is utterly their forever home. So, this is the **permanent resident area** of our voiceless kids.



Record of admitted animals, their case papers, record of treatment, stock record of food, medicine etc. are stored in this unit. The control and administration of the whole shelter and Hospital is directed from this Centre. The **admin block** is facilitated with computers, printers and file cabinets. To keep an eye on our kids, our shelter is under surveillance of the CCTV cameras whose server is also located in this admin Block.

All the greenery you're seeing here is the result of efforts put by us to plant the **saplings that turned into trees** and now that our babies can rest under the shade of these trees.





**Our caretaker family prepares food for all the animals living here, hence for storing dog food and grains like rice, wheat, millet etc; we've built a **Food Storage room** here.**



**Any animal suffering from skin disease is given medicated bath and wiped with a towel and is massaged with medicated oil, then after we admit them at our animal shelter.**



**Let's now proceed towards our **aviary**. We all know that Uttarayan Festival is a deadly time for birds, when lots of birds get injured with the thread used for flying kites. We rescue such birds and bring them to our animal hospital where their medication and surgery is done and we take care of them till the time that they are ready to fly back to the blue skies.**



**We've facilitated each room with lights and fans, makes it look like a hotel for speechless animals. The rooms are built with proper drainage and ventilation facilities so to make the surrounding healthy, comfortable and adaptable for the admitted animals**





You might be wondering why there's a swimming pool inside an animal Hospital? Actually, it's not a swimming pool. It's a **pool for hydrotherapy**, which is a type of swimming exercise given to animals that lose movement in their limbs due to accident or paralysis



To meet our daily water requirement, for cleaning the rooms, for animals to drink, for preparing food, for bathing the animals etc we have a bore well inside our shelter premises. We also have a water tank, so that even if there is no electricity available, our animals can have access to water.



To keep an eye on our kids, our shelter is under surveillance of the CCTV cameras, our whole shelter is equipped with flood lights all around.



We have enclosed our shelter and hospital inside a 6 feet **boundary** wall topped by 2 feet of **fencing**, to prevent our naughty kids from escaping during their treatment.

**A home for all sick, abandoned and injured animals. We would have loved it if you could have come personally to see our world of care and compassion. But if that is not possible, we're presenting our animal shelter here. Situated in nature's lap, next to a Water Canal in Anand district of Gujarat state, Aashiyana for animals is a home to uncountable sick and injured speechless stray animals**





**This land is leased. Few years have already rushed by and within a few more we will have to vacate. We have purchased another land in the same village. All the facilities we constructed on the leased land were of precast material. On the newly purchased land, we wish to build a permanent and strong infrastructure for the homeless animals that would sustain for decades.**





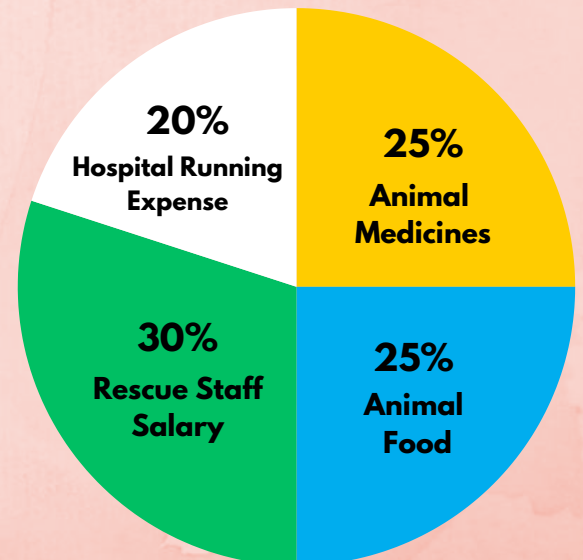

# **ALIGNMENT WITH ACTIVITIES MENTIONED IN SCHEDULE VII CSR - SECTION-135 - COMPANIES ACT**

- If hospital services extend to rural or peri-urban areas for animal care in villages, this supports rural welfare and resilience of farming communities reliant on livestock.

- In areas with high stray animal populations (often urban slums), this hospital aids public sanitation and health safety through stray treatment, vaccination, and sterilization drives.



# IMPACT OF THE PROJECT

- 1. Enhanced Medical Infrastructure for Animal Care** : With dedicated spaces such as OPD, OT, and diagnostic facilities (X-Ray, USG, Laboratory), the hospital unit will significantly elevate the quality, speed, and scope of medical intervention for injured, sick, or rescued animals—reducing suffering and increasing survival outcomes.
- 2. Disease Detection, Prevention, and Control** : Equipped with a modern laboratory and vaccination infrastructure, the hospital can swiftly identify and contain outbreaks among animals, thereby minimizing the risk of zoonotic diseases. This plays a crucial role in public health safety and preventive veterinary care.
- 3. Emergency Response and Critical Care** : A fully functional Operation Theatre (OT) and emergency-ready OPD ensure that life-saving surgeries and treatments are administered without delay. This capability is essential for rescuing severely injured or abused animals and stabilizing trauma cases.
- 4. Streamlined Veterinary Supply Management** : The dedicated medical storage room ensures proper inventory, hygiene, and availability of essential medicines and surgical supplies—improving operational efficiency and reducing treatment delays due to shortages.
- 5. Improved Shelter-to-Adoption Pipeline** : Healthy animals are more likely to be adopted. The hospital unit supports shelter animals in recovering from illness or injury swiftly and safely, thereby improving their adoption readiness and promoting responsible pet ownership.
- 6. Training, Research, and Capacity Building** : The clinical infrastructure allows for internships, veterinary workshops, and hands-on learning for aspiring vets, students, and volunteers—contributing to a skilled local workforce in the field of animal healthcare.
- 7. Centralized Coordination and Data Management** : The administrative office within the hospital unit serves as a nerve center for managing cases, coordinating rescues, maintaining medical records, and collaborating with external agencies—ensuring efficient animal welfare operations.
- 8. Humane and Professionalized Animal Healthcare Ecosystem** : The hospital unit symbolizes a shift from reactive rescue to a proactive, systematized, and dignified approach to animal health. It sets a regional benchmark in compassionate, science-based veterinary care.
